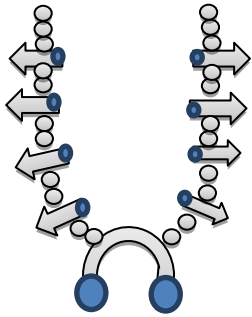


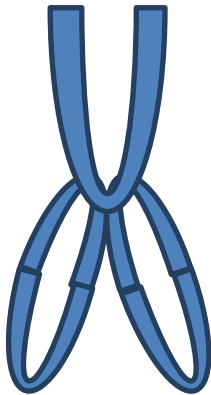
TAB NECKLACE

The blue shapes represent slab turquoise, the red represents heishi. Heishi are beads made by making a string of drilled nuggets, then rolling the nuggets against a grindstone until there is only a narrow cylinder of stone left around the string.



SQUASH BLOSSOM NECKLACE

The gray circles represent handmade, hollow silver beads, the silver arrows represent the flower-shaped blossom beads, which sometimes have turquoise incorporated on them as shown. The silver U-shaped feature is a naja, in this case with turquoise stones set at the terminations.



ROLLED TURQUOISE BEAD NECKLACE

The blue forms represent turquoise heishi. The main necklace is a string of turquoise cylinders formed into a continuous snake-like necklace. The two loops are called joclas. These were originally ear pieces that were attached to the necklace when not worn on the ears. Now these necklaces may some with the joclas permanently attached to the necklace.
